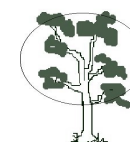

Ruth Carson and Graham Ross

Ruth and Graham contribute widely to folk, historical and cultural celebrations with their storytelling. Among the events where they've performed are: The Gumeracha Medieval Fair, family days at The Art Gallery of South Australia, special exhibitions at The Maritime Museum at Port Adelaide, The Eudunda Storytelling Festival and National Storytelling Festivals. They are both long term members of the Storytelling Guild of Australia (SA), an organisation which actively promotes oral storytelling among adults and children alike.

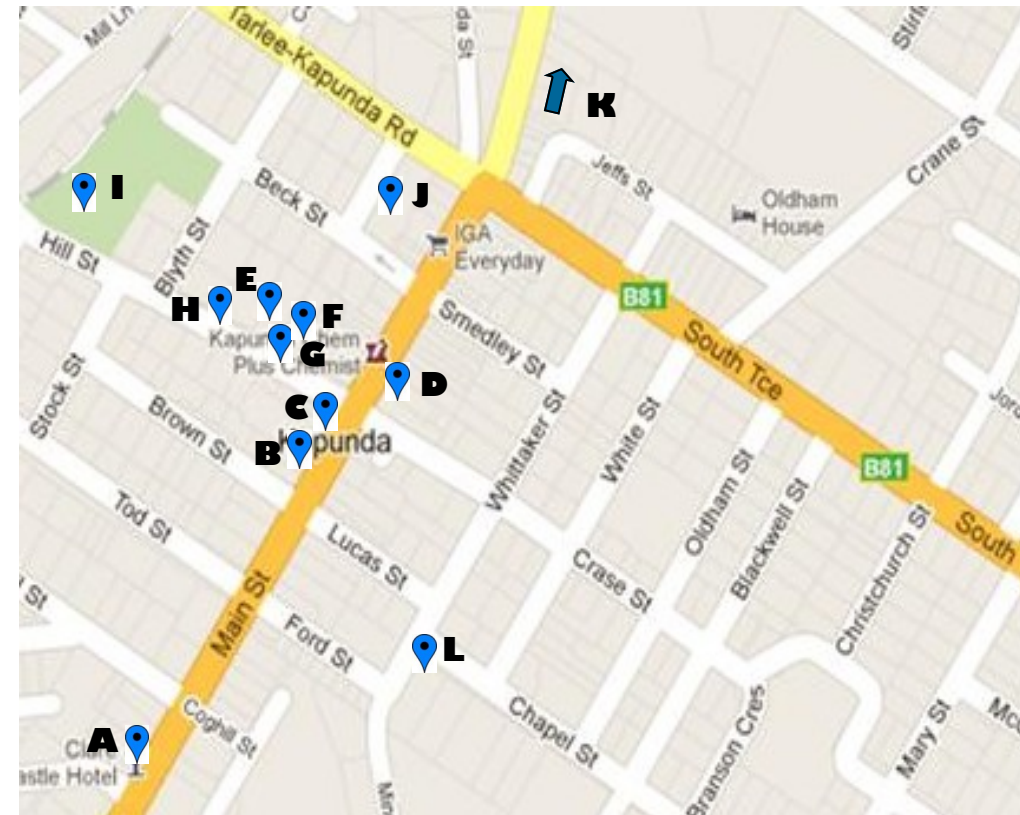

15 year old Adelaide girl **SIOBHAN OWEN** was born in North Wales to a Welsh father and Irish mother. She is a classically trained singer who enchants audiences with her haunting voice and Celtic harp performing beautiful renditions of traditional Celtic songs. Siobhan is the winner of the 2009 SA Folk Awards Most Outstanding New or Emerging Talent.

Discover a powerful fusion of female vocals, fiddle music and rhythm! With their unique minimalist sound, **THE FIDDLE CHICKS** started out as a musical experiment and have proven themselves to be one of SA's most endearing acts. Their dynamic musical style ranges from traditional Celtic, European, Gypsy, blues, roots and American folk music, but it is their original compositions and rich fiddle soundscapes (utilising some clever digital effects) that really win over audiences. The Fiddle Chicks are the winners of ADRA's 2008 Emily Burrows Award and eight SA Folk Awards from 2006-2008.

With sweet harmonies and spellbinding voices, **RUBY MOON** will captivate any audience. This duo (Nikkie Nicholson and Adrienne Piggott) hailing from the Adelaide Hills and rural South Australia perform songs that encompass traditional Celtic and Gaelic, weaving through Americana and English folk to contemporary Australiana. With acapella, guitar, mandolin and bodhran accompaniment, this duo really are unique and have something to please everyone. Nikkie Nicholson has performed solo since she was 13 and has also played with bands Twa Corbies and Morrighan. Nikkie won the Celtic singing competition at the Kapunda Celtic Festival in 1997. Adrienne Piggott has been performing and recording for a number of years with a variety of bands (from traditional folk to folk rock) including Spiral Dance, Ji'Dasc and Circe's Tricks. Adrienne also won Most outstanding vocalist for the S.A. Folk Awards 2006.

FAIRE D' OPHELIA are an original Celtic/medieval acoustic trio. They blend together beautiful harmonies and haunting melodies with percussion and acoustic guitar. Bernadette and Rebecca



History of the Celtic Festival

The Kapunda Celtic Festival is the longest running Celtic Festival in Australia. Beginning in 1976 it was formed in response to the enthusiastic St Patrick's Day celebrations held by the Kapunda Celtic community each year.

The festival celebrates the cultural heritage of the seven Celtic groups—the Irish, Scots, Welsh, Cornish, Manx, Bretons and Galicians—although most of the Kapunda immigrants were Irish, Welsh and Cornish.

The original festival in 1976 centered around free entertainment, dancing, competitions, sports and bands. Traditionally staged in and around the Main Street of Kapunda, the rich heritage of the historic building facades were used as a backdrop to performances.

SIBIN (pronounced shibeen) is an Irish Folk/covers band based in Mildura, Victoria. They play a broad array of Irish/Celtic and Australian folk that incites toe-tapping to lively tunes led by melodies played on an equally broad array of instruments including the tin whistle, mandolin, flute, guitar and even banjo. Sibeen are also extremely well versed in popular and classic covers including Van Morrison, U2, The Beatles, Hoodoo Gurus, The Proclaimers, Powderfinger, Blink 182, Green Day, Paul Kelly and many more!

Phil Parker, Andrew Hook, Dave Taylor, Geoff Bridgland are **OLD SOUTH BLUEGRASS**. Bluegrass, Americana, Folk; they've kept the best of the old and the best of the new. Hot bluegrass, soulful blues, smooth harmonies, fast instrumentals; with over 100 years of collective playing experience, all wrapped in the joy of singing and playing acoustic only.

The **BORDER CELTS** are a contemporary Step and Reel dance team that bring to the modern world an ancient form of dance from the Picts of the Highlands of Scotland, that dates back to the 5th century. Described by 'Pliny the Younger', a Roman historian of the times, as "a dance like training in order to battle", these ritual dance steps and movements were performed at times of celebrations and to honour the seasons. Proud members of the Scottish Association, the Celts wear the "black watch tartan", traditionally worn by the Border Rogues and their motto is "Allegiance to None". Established in 1999, the Celts perform at a wide variety of cultural events and festivals throughout the year and since 2006 feature **AN GHILLE M' HOR**, our Jacobite broadsword dancers, who perform the next recorded form of dance in Scottish history.
